EP hosts event on SMEs and family-friendly initiatives

Social Affairs Adviser Helen Hoffmann participated on 23 April in a joint meeting of the Family and Protection of Childhood and SME Intergroups at the European Parliament. Chaired by Marie Panayotopoulos-Cassiotou MEP and Othmar Karas MEP, the event discussed family-friendly initiatives adopted by SMEs. Speakers included Françoise Le Bail, SME Envoy at the European Commission, who underlined SMEs' crucial contribution to economic growth and competitiveness. Ms Hoffmann recalled the legal obligations in place and the ongoing activities of the European Social Partners targeted at improving and identifying new measures to reconcile family and professional life. She also stressed the benefits of family-friendly measures for SMEs and the external dimension whereby SMEs are socially responsible actors deeply embedded in the local community. Dr Alexander von Gabain, a successful entrepreneur in the biotech sector and a renowned University Professor, recently announced his decision to stand as candidate for the Governing Board of the European Institute of Technology. Trained and educated as a molecular biologist, Dr von Gabain held posts at the Universities of Heidelberg, Stanford and Umea. He currently teaches microbiology at the Vienna University and vaccinology at the Stockholm School of Medicine. In 1998, Dr von Gabain founded Intercell, today one of the five largest biotech enterprises in Europe with its 220 employees. UEAPME backs Dr von Gabain's application, and is strongly convinced that his academic and business curriculum have the potential of making a strong contribution to the EIT Board from the outset. SMEs key drivers of sustainability in tourism sector

Enterprise Policy Director Luc Hendrickx spoke on 19 April at a conference organised by the SME Union on "Sustainable tourism in Europe: chances and challenges

for SMEs” in Sofia, Bulgaria. His panel was devoted specifically to the role of SMEs in the tourism sector. Seasonality and the lack of skilled workforce are a major challenge for European tourist destinations and for their economy, said Mr Hendrickx. As far as sustainability is concerned, he stressed the role of SMEs as guardians of the authenticity of the local culture and of its products and services. Other issues such as real estate developments should also be taken into consideration, pointed out Mr Hendrickx, who concluded with a call for “more and better” data on tourism-related economic activities in the EU.
